

OBTAINING AN ONLINE MOTOR VEHICLE RECORD (MVR)

Viewing Driver Record via Bureau of Motor Vehicles Website

OVERVIEW

Need to employ drivers for your company cars or delivery vehicles? Did you know there is an easy way to check driving records straight from the Ohio BMV? Make sure your potential employee has a clean driving record by following a few simple steps. This short how-to information sheet is a step-by-step guide to using the Bureau of Motor Vehicles website.

STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS:

1. From your internet browser, go to the Bureau of Motor Vehicles website:

bmv.ohio.gov

2. In the **More Services** box, select **BMV Records**.

3. On the next page, scroll down to the **Unofficial Copy of Your Driver Record (Two-Year)** area, then click the link to under **How to Request** to go to the final page to complete the form.



UNOFFICIAL COPY OF YOUR DRIVER RECORD (TWO-YEAR)

The Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) permits individuals to view their moving violation convictions, accident involvement reports and other actions that result in license suspensions, revocations or other disqualifications for the last two years. The driver record is consistent with the Ohio point assessment and suspension law.

4. Choose one of the two ways to search for the information. Information you will need to complete request:

Option 1: Driver License Number
Birth Date
First Letter of Last Name
Last 4 digits of SSN

Option 2: Last Name – First Name – Middle Name or Initial
Suffix
Birth Date
Last 4 digits of SSN

Click **Continue** to Submit Request

5. The **Unofficial Driver Abstract Report** will be displayed.
